

Hardship Persists in 2022


Households Below the ALICE Threshold:



- **Hancock = 55%, 1,467 HH**








Labor Status, Age 16+ in Washington Co.

Labor Status, Population 16 and Over, Washington County, Maryland, 2022








ALICE Wage Tool: 1 Adult

1 Adult on \$15 per Hour per Worker Wage Compared to Household Survival Budget, Maryland










Most Common Industries for Workers Below ALICE Threshold with Number of Workers and Average Full-Time Hourly Wage




Work Schedules, Workers Below ALICE Threshold




Most Common Industries for Workers Below ALICE Threshold with Number of Workers and Average Full-Time Hourly Wage
















Owner Cost Burden, Households Below ALICE Threshold










Older Americans on the Brink

ALICE Essentials Index outpaces CPI, both spiking 2021-2023

ALICE Essentials, U.S.: 3.3%



ALICE Can't Catch Up

ALICE still can't gain ground:

- Cost of basics has grown
- Wages had been stagnant
- Wages in some jobs rise at slower rates
- ALICE often works hourly, parttime, and/or are gig workers







When Wage Increases Aren't Enough

Maryland's Child Care Workers:

- Median annual wage increased by \$3.69 per hour or 36% (2010 to 2022)
- \$19,500 short of basic survival budget
- \$24,132 short of basic survival budget

Ultimately, ALICE is even further behind
